- Analyze the collected data to assess the project's impact.
- Prepare a comprehensive endline survey report, including findings, analysis, and recommendations.
- Present key findings to GDA and relevant stakeholders.

1. Inception report outlining the methodology, tools, and work plan.
2. Survey instruments and data collection tools.
1. Submit all raw data collected during the survey to GDA for future use, including quantitative and qualitative data files, interview transcripts, and focus group discussion (FGD) notes.
2. Draft report with preliminary findings.
3. Final report both in **Lao and English** incorporating feedback from GDA that **includes:** 1) An executive summary, 2) Detailed findings and analysis, and 3) Recommendations for further program development.
4. Presentation of key findings to GDA and stakeholders.
